Overall objective: The Adaptation Partnership action pledges respond to the following NWP objective: To make informed decisions on practical adaptation actions and measures to respond to climate change on a sound scientific, technical and socio-economic basis, taking into account current and future climate change and variability.

1) Title of Action Pledge: Review of Adaptation Action

Action Pledge purpose: The review synthesizes current adaptation efforts and identified needs and priorities from around the world. This action pledge informs NWP stakeholders of the availability of the review so that they can use the information it provides about countries' identified needs, relevant national policies and documents, and existing and proposed adaptation actions to make more informed decisions on practical adaptation actions and measures to respond to climate change.

Actions: The Partnership commissioned IISD to produce the review, and is subsequently in the process of disseminating its findings to targeted knowledge platforms, policy-makers, and practitioners. This includes organizations and knowledge platforms like the UNDP's Adaptation Learning Mechanism, Adaptation Atlas, and the World Bank.

Expected results: The review is published and its documents are available on websites and through list-serves or newsletters. Additionally, the data is expected to be integrated into compatible databases on available knowledge platforms, like the ALM or Adaptation Atlas.

Indicators of achievement: Successful dissemination of the review as measured by (1) the number of organizations or institutions following through on disseminating the review (that is, sharing it, posting it, or integrating it into their knowledge platforms) and (2) the number of governments reached through Climate-L. An additional indicator could include tracking the number of times the review is downloaded from the Adaptation Partnership site, but it is still unclear whether or not this is possible – if so, this will be a third indicator.
