On the occasion of the special early release of World Energy Outlook 2009, this technical briefing by the International Energy Agency details the energy transition to 450 - globally and for eight key regions. It provides a detailed breakdown of emissions, investments, costs and financing in a 450 world - across power, industry, transport and buildings - and contrasts these with the latest Reference Scenario, which takes into account the impact of the financial crisis.
