Based on Chad's Vision 2030, Chad NAP, SDGs, NDC0.2 African Union's Agenda 2063 of a context in which Chad, is seeking to consolidate its position on the economic, social and environmental levels, while fully integrating into the framework of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) therefore Here's a structured response, based on the uploaded Chad NAP documents and related mission reports, about how Chad's participation in the Article 6.4 mechanism can contribute to sustainable development, while respecting that the consideration of sustainable development is a national prerogative:

Chad's Participation in the Article 6.4 Mechanism and Sustainable Development

1. National Prerogative on Sustainable Development

Under the Paris Agreement, the determination of whether activities under the Article 6.4 mechanism contribute to sustainable development is explicitly the prerogative of the host country. For Chad, this means that any mitigation project engaging with international carbon markets must first align with national priorities identified in its National Adaptation Plan (NAP), Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), and sectoral development strategies. Chad therefore retains full sovereignty to assess, approve, and monitor whether projects deliver tangible socio-economic and environmental co-benefits for its population.

2. Alignment with Chad's National Adaptation Priorities

The NAP and related workshops highlight Chad's sectoral vulnerabilities and adaptation needs in water, health, infrastructure and energy, ecosystems, education, waste, urban planning, and disaster risk management. Article 6.4 projects, if properly aligned, can generate outcomes such as:

- **Water security:** deployment of solar water pumps and irrigation systems to strengthen climate-resilient agriculture.
- **Health resilience:** integration of climate surveillance into health systems and expanded access to sanitation infrastructure.
- **Energy access:** expansion of renewable energy capacity (solar, wind) to power cities and reduce vulnerability of food storage and health systems.
- **we also looking to install 10kwts of solar panels including batteries in each house within cities so as to allow communities for direct acces to the funds and beneficiaries from a carbon projects without going to centralised gov system besides injecting to the whole governments system in which communities still paying for the electricity .**
- **Infrastructure resilience:** building flood-resistant and climate-smart transport networks that facilitate agricultural trade and protect urban populations.
- **Ecosystem restoration:** reforestation under the Great Green Wall to combat desertification and protect biodiversity.

These co-benefits directly overlap with Chad's sustainable development priorities.

3. Potential Contributions of Article 6.4 to Sustainable Development

Participation in the mechanism can deliver:

- **Finance for transformative projects:** mobilization of international investments into large-scale adaptation-mitigation synergies (e.g., renewable energy grids, resilient water infrastructure).
- **Technology transfer:** access to advanced low-carbon technologies (early warning systems, clean transport, efficient irrigation) that improve resilience and productivity.

- **Capacity building:** strengthening national institutions such as the NDA(Art6.4 NFP which is secretary of the NDA), the Meteorological Agency, and local communities in monitoring, verification, and implementation of climate actions.
- **Job creation and livelihoods:** projects that integrate displaced people, women, and vulnerable groups into land restoration, renewable energy deployment, and urban resilience initiatives.
- **Social and environmental safeguards:** ensuring that mitigation activities avoid harm, while generating measurable adaptation and development co-benefits.

4. Institutional Safeguards and Governance

Chad's participation in Article 6.4 will be governed by:

- The National Designated Authority (NDA) through the NFP for Art6.4(Secretary of the NDA), which already coordinates climate finance and GCF advisory Board member rep Africa, and to ensure coherence between finance, market projects and national priorities.
- the ART6.4 FP is secretary in charge of coordinating Inter-ministerial committee for ART6 , which integrates mitigation, adaptation and just transition across water, health, energy, transport, education, and urban systems. this Mechanisms established under Art6 to track and report on sustainable development co-benefits at the national level, including carbon market projects and policies regulation and compliance.

Chad's participation in the Article 6.4 mechanism offers an opportunity to attract climate finance, transfer technology, and implement transformative low-carbon, climate-resilient projects. However, in line with the Paris Agreement, the determination of sustainable development contributions remains a national prerogative. By aligning Article 6.4 activities with the priorities identified in the NAP, NDC, and national development strategies, Chad can ensure that international carbon market participation not only reduces emissions but also drives inclusive, sustainable, and climate-resilient development for its peoples.

Types of Activities Under Article 6.4 That Chad May Approve

Chad prioritizes activities under Article 6.4 that align with its climate commitments and sustainable development priorities. Pursuant to Chapter V.C (approval and authorization) of the Rules, Modalities, and Procedures (RMPs), Chad would consider the following types of activities:

1. **Renewable Energy Development:** Solar, wind, hydropower, and bioenergy projects to increase access to clean energy and reduce dependence on fossil fuels. Distributed energy systems for rural and off-grid communities.

2. **Energy Efficiency Improvements:** Industrial energy efficiency programs to lower emissions in manufacturing and processing sectors. Urban and rural energy-saving initiatives, including building retrofits and efficient cookstoves.

3. **Sustainable Land Use and Forestry:** Afforestation, reforestation, and forest management projects to enhance carbon sequestration. Community-based forestry programs that engage local populations and protect biodiversity.

4. **Agriculture and Waste Management :**

Climate-smart agricultural practices to reduce methane and nitrous oxide emissions. Waste-to-energy projects and improved waste management systems to reduce emissions from landfills.

5. **Transport Sector Projects:** Electric vehicle infrastructure and sustainable public transportation systems.

I. 6. Adaptation and Resilience Co-benefit Projects: Activities that integrate climate adaptation with mitigation, such as water resource management linked with energy or forestry projects.

II. Contribution to Chad's NDC and Long-term Low GHG Emission Development Strategy

1. Alignment with NDC Commitments: Chad's NDC highlights key mitigation targets across energy, forestry, agriculture, and waste sectors. A6.4 activities will directly support these priorities by: Delivering measurable emission reductions or removals in sectors identified in the NDC. Mobilizing private and international financing to scale up the implementation of NDC commitments. Contributing to the transition to a low-carbon economy while fostering sustainable development co-benefits.

2. Support for Long-term Low GHG Emission Development Strategy (LT-LEDS): Although Chad has not yet submitted a formal LT-LEDS, the country has expressed interest in achieving net-zero emissions by 2050. A6.4 activities will support this trajectory by:

- Deploying clean technologies and infrastructure that reduce long-term emissions.
- Promoting systemic changes in key sectors such as energy, transport, and land use.
- Building institutional capacity to integrate mitigation projects into national planning frameworks.

3. Contributing to the Paris Agreement's Long-term Goals: A6.4 activities will help Chad align with the overarching goals of the Paris Agreement by:

- o Enhancing global mitigation ambition through high-integrity emission reductions.
- o Supporting sustainable development while addressing climate adaptation needs, ensuring a

- o just transition for all stakeholders.
- o Strengthening the role of carbon markets in accelerating cost-effective, scalable climate action.

Mechanisms for Approval and Authorization Chad will implement a robust approval and authorization process to ensure that A6.4 activities:

- Comply with national priorities, environmental and social safeguards, and sustainable development objectives.
- Demonstrate additionality and align with high-integrity standards.
- Avoid double-counting by ensuring proper reporting and corresponding adjustments under the transparency framework.

By carefully selecting and managing A6.4 activities, Chad seeks to maximize their contribution to its NDC, long-term low-emission development strategy, and the global climate goals of the Paris Agreement.
