Key themes

- 01 Quantitative finance flows
- 02 Access to climate finance
- 03 Impacts, results, and outcomes

Challenges

- Attribution of flows, lack of granularity, inflation impacts
- Slow, complex access; high capital costs
- Limited transparency on disbursements, weak local-level data

Opportunities

- National taxonomies, digitalization, qualitative markers
- KPI frameworks, GCF reforms, stronger regional presence
- Integrated results frameworks, participatory reporting, national monitoring systems
