#### Title of the event:

### Climate Change and Food Security: Scaling-up Agriculture Climate Action

### Scope and objectives of the event:

As part of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Climate Week in Africa, the UNFCCC Secretariat will organize an implementation lab on agriculture as part of the Implementation Forum. This will highlight the political consensus on agriculture climate action, and then empower Party delegates and stakeholders to discuss implementation of best practices, current trends and future solutions.

The implementation lab on agriculture will combine short dynamic action-oriented input presentations with interactive roundtable discussions centered on the potential of agriculture to contribute to the objectives of the Paris Agreement while also safeguarding food security and ending hunger.

#### Expected outcomes:

- 1. Overview of political signals for strengthening agriculture climate action
- 2. Draft framework for prioritizing specific activities
- 3. Identification of financial and capacity-building resources for implementation
- 4. Overview of considerations for partnerships with research institutes, private sector and civil society
- 5. Identification of practitioners and priority issues for inclusion in the Sharm el-Sheikh online portal
