Ambassador Carlos Fuller is the Permanent Representative Designate of Belize to the United Nations in New York. He is a Vice President of the Conference of the Parties (COP) of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and has served as the Chairman of its Subsidiary Body on Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) and served on the Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee (JISC) and the Consultative Group of Experts (CGE).

Prior to his appointment, Ambassador Fuller was the Regional and International Liaison Officer at the Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre where his primary responsibility was to coordinate CARICOM Member States in the international climate change negotiation process. Ambassador Fuller is a Meteorologist and was the Chief Meteorologist of the National Meteorological Service of Belize. He is a member of the WMO Standing Committee on Climate Services (SC-CLI) and serves on the climate policy sub-committee of its Climate Coordination Panel (CCP). He holds the George Price Lifetime Achievement Award for Emergency Management and the Officer of the Order the British Empire (OBE) for public service.
