Option 1:

The Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) welcomed the information provided by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) in its report to the Conference of the Parties at its twenty-ninth session and its addendum¹ on financial support requested, approved and provided for the preparation of national communications (NCs) and biennial update reports (BURs) by Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (non-Annex I Parties), including support provided through the joint programme of the Capacity-building Initiative for Transparency and the Global Support Programme for Preparation of National Communications and Biennial Update Reports by non-Annex I Parties.

Option 2:

The Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) welcomed the information provided by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) in its reports to the Conference of the Parties at its twenty-eighth session and to SBI 60² on financial support requested, approved and provided for the preparation of national communications (NCs) and biennial update reports (BURs) by Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (non-Annex I Parties), including support provided through the joint programme of the Capacity-building Initiative for Transparency and the Global Support Programme for Preparation of National Communications and Biennial Update Reports by non-Annex I Parties.

The SBI further welcomed the ongoing work of the GEF on streamlining the project approval process and underscored the importance of this work to avoid financial support gaps, helping to ensure the sustainability of reporting arrangements for non-Annex I Parties for preparing their NCs.

The SBI underscored the importance of the provision of adequate and timely financial and technical support to non-Annex I Parties, and of streamlining and simplifying the existing procedures of the GEF and its implementing agencies, as well as of exploring alternative programming modalities, procedures and processes, in accordance with the GEF mandate, in order to facilitate and expedite the access of developing country Parties to financial resources, enabling them to meet their measurement, reporting and verification obligations under the Convention and building and enhancing their institutional and technical capacity on a continuous basis.

Option 3:

The SBI underscored the importance of the provision of predictable financial and technical support to non-Annex I Parties, including by the GEF, and the need for non-Annex I Parties to utilize available financial resources, fulfil their reporting obligations under the Convention on a continuous basis and build or enhance their institutional and technical capacity, including that of their national technical teams, for reporting in a sustainable manner.

Option 4:

The SBI underscored the importance of the continued provision of adequate and timely financial and technical support to non-Annex I Parties and of streamlining and simplifying the existing procedures of the GEF and its implementing agencies.

The SBI also underscored the importance of the GEF continuing to implement alternative programming modalities, procedures and processes, in accordance with its mandate, for facilitating and expediting the access of non-Annex I Parties to financial resources, enhancing their ability to prepare their reports and building and enhancing their institutional and technical capacity for reporting on a continuous basis.

The SBI noted that non-Annex I Parties continue to face challenges in fulfilling their reporting obligations under the Convention and [also noted the importance of the provision of] [require further] [financial, technical and capacity-building] support, including for strengthening their national reporting systems, [for meeting] [to meet] those obligations on a continuous basis, including by strengthening national reporting systems [to be in a digital form].

The SBI noted that non-Annex I Parties continue to face challenges in fulfilling their reporting obligations under the Convention and also noted the importance of the provision of financial, technical and capacity-building support, including for strengthening their national reporting systems, for meeting those obligations.

The SBI noted that non-Annex I Parties continue to face challenges in reporting under the Convention and require further financial, technical and capacity-building support to enhance their domestic capacity for and ensure continuity in meeting their reporting obligations, including support for establishing and enhancing national reporting systems.

Option 5:

The SBI noted that non-Annex I Parties continue to face challenges in fulfilling their reporting obligations under the Convention and require continued support to enhance their capacity to prepare their NCs.

Recalling paragraphs 38–46 of decision 1/CP.24, the SBI underscored the importance of providing support to non-Annex I Parties that are also Parties to the Paris Agreement in an integrated manner with a view to addressing the challenges referred to in paragraph 5 above and enabling them to fulfil their reporting obligations under both the Convention and the Paris Agreement and invited the GEF and its implementing agencies to explore ways to ensure that the transition from the provision of funding for the completion of BURs to that for the completion of BTRs does not hinder the timely completion of the respective reports.
