Report on the 14th meeting of the Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures

I. Opening of the meeting

1. The secretariat opened the 14th meeting of the Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures (KCI 14) on Thursday 4 June 2026 at 9.31 a.m. Central European Summer Time and asserted that the quorum requirement had been met.

II. Organizational matters

A. Election of the Co-Chairs for 2026–2027

3. The KCI agreed to elect Sangji Lee and Peter Govindasamy as Co-Chairs of the KCI for term of office 2026–2028 (ending immediately before the first meeting of the KCI in 2028). The KCI expressed its appreciation to Angelina Tutuah Mensah and Moustapha Kamal Gueye for their leadership and service over the past term.

B. Adoption of the agenda

4. The KCI adopted the agenda for KCI 14.²

C. Organization of work

5. The Co-Chairs presented, and the KCI took note of, the proposed work schedule for the meeting.³

D. Membership matters

6. The secretariat presented, and the KCI took note of, information on the membership status.⁴ The KCI also welcomed new members and thanked outgoing members for their contributions in progressing work of the KCI.

III. Updates on relevant meetings, events and initiatives

A. Outcomes of the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Belém and activities of the Katowice Committee on Impacts

7. The secretariat presented, and the KCI took note of, information on this matter.

9. The secretariat presented, and the KCI took note of the progress of implementation of mandates for the KCI.

IV. Implementation of the workplan of the forum and its Katowice Committee on Impacts for 2020–2025⁵

A. Enhance the capacity and understanding of Parties, through collaboration and input from stakeholders, on the assessment and analysis of the impacts of the implementation of response measures to facilitate the undertaking of economic diversification and transformation and just transition (activity 4)

10. The secretariat presented and the KCI took note of the progress made in the implementation of the activity, and agreed to conclude the activity.

B. Development of a case study in each of the five United Nations regions in accordance with activity 7 of the workplan (activity 12)

11. The Co-Chairs presented the status of the six case studies developed under activity 12.

12. The KCI took note of publication of case studies titled:

(a) “Assessing climate and socioeconomic effects of agricultural credit policies: A case study of Brazil”,

(b) “Understanding the implications of the energy transition on African economies: Economy and jobs” and

(c) “The impacts and incentives inherent in destination-based carbon pricing: A case study on India”.

13. With regard to the case study entitled “Economic diversification and climate policy integration in Nigeria: A case study from Nigeria”, the working group, with the support of the secretariat, presented the updated draft report⁶ of the case study. The KCI agreed to provide written comments on executive summary and agreed to finalize it prior to KCI 15.

14. With regards to the case study entitled “Impacts of clean transition policies on employment in the European Union and European Union just transition policies”, the working group provided update, and the KCI agreed to consider the updated report during inter session period with a view to finalizing it prior to KCI 15.

15. With regards to the case study entitled “Assessing the impacts of climate response measures for planning effective and just transition pathways: case study for Ghana”, the KCI provided comments and agreed to consider the revised report prior to KCI 15 with a view to finalizing it prior to KCI 15.

V. Implementation of the workplan of the forum and its Katowice Committee on Impacts for 2026–2030

A. Prepare information for the technical assessment component of the global stocktake related to the impacts of the implementation of response measures with the process outlined in paragraphs 12–13 of decision 23/CMA.3 (paras. 8 and 24 of decision 19/CMA.1) (activity 2)

16. The secretariat presented and the KCI took note of the process and tentative timeline for the second global stocktake (GST).

17. The KCI agreed to organize a technical workshop to prepare input for the second GST as part of the KCI 15, noting that a virtual technical workshop can be organized as a follow up in the case the KCI is not able to conclude the matter.

B. Assess and analyse the impacts, including socioeconomic impacts, of response measures to be implemented in order to achieve all outcomes of the global stocktake and different net zero scenarios and pathways (activity 5)

18. A member of the working group presented draft scope of the study as contained in the concept note.⁷

19. The KCI agreed on the scope of the report as contained in annex 2 of this report. The KCI agreed that the working group will advance work on this matter and provide an update at KCI 15.

C. Analyse, assess and report on the impacts of measures taken to combat climate change, including cross-border impacts, recalling Article 3, paragraph 5, of the Convention (activity 6)

20. A member of the working group presented draft scope of the study as contained in the concept note.⁸

21. The KCI agreed on the scope of the report as contained in annex 3 of this report. The KCI agreed that the working group will advance work on this matter and provide an update at KCI 15.

D. Facilitate the exchange and sharing of experience and best practices among Parties, the secretariat and other international organizations on conducting impact assessments (activity 8)

22. The KCI exchanged views on the possible objectives and substantive focus of the in-session workshop to be held at SB 65 under this activity and requested the secretariat to take these views into account in the organization of the workshop.

E. Develop a toolbox that can be customized to local circumstances, including methodologies, for Parties to use in identifying, assessing and addressing the impacts of response measures, and build capacity and share experience in relation to using the toolbox (activity 10)

23. The secretariat presented the concept note⁹ and the KCI exchanged views on information that can be used for the development of a toolbox to assess and address the impacts of the implementation of response measures.

24. KCI agreed that a working group will work, with a view to propose and agree on an approach for implementation of this activity at its next meeting.

F. Develop a case study in each of the five United Nations regions on just transition of the workforce and the creation of decent work and quality jobs and on economic diversification and transformation in order to understand the opportunities and challenges faced in planning and implementation, and share the findings among Parties and experts (activity 11)

25. A member of the working group presented draft scope of studies as contained in the concept note.¹⁰

26. The KCI agreed to further explore all options, as contained in annex 4, to develop case studies, including the possibility of a single study covering multiple regions where feasible.

27. The KCI requested the working group, supported by secretariat, to develop and launch a call for expressions of interest for Parties and observers, with a view to identifying potential organizations, priority options, and relevant countries or regions, and agreed to proceed with the development of case studies on the basis of the responses received.

G. Develop case studies to identify and analyse the social and economic impacts of economy-wide nationally determined contributions, covering all greenhouse gases, sectors and categories (activity 12)

28. A member of the working group presented draft scope of the study as contained in the concept note.¹¹

29. The KCI agreed on the scope of the report as contained in annex 5 of this report. The KCI agreed that the working group will work advance work on this matter and provide an update at KCI 15.

H. Assess and compile guidelines for reporting, in the context of the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement, on the assessment and analysis of the impacts of the implementation of response measures on Parties with economies most affected by the impacts of response measures as referred to in Article 4, paragraph 15, of the Paris Agreement (activity 13)

30. The KCI exchanged views and requested its Co-Chairs to reach out to the CGE, with a view to identifying, assessing and analysing challenges and gaps related to reporting on the impacts of the implementation of response measures and associated guidelines, and to propose a strategy for preparing the report as an output of this activity.

31. Further, the KCI agreed to invite the CGE to its fifteenth meeting to discuss this matter.

I. Enhance the capacity of Parties to carry out their own assessment and analysis of and produce reports on the impacts of the implementation of response measures through training and capacity-building efforts, including existing initiatives (activity 15)

32. The secretariat presented and the KCI took note of the progress made in implementation of the activity.

J. Identify and exchange experience on technological solutions aimed at reducing climate change impacts and creating decent work (activity 16)

33. The secretariat presented the concept note and the KCI agreed that the first technical paper for this activity will cover the elements proposed for agriculture, forestry & land-use; renewable energy and electrification; and sustainable energy and hard-to-abate sectors.

VI. Capacity-building programme aimed at assisting Parties in undertaking an assessment of the impacts of the implementation of response measures

34. The secretariat presented and the KCI took note of the progress made in implementation of the capacity building program.

VII. Communication and outreach strategy

35. The secretariat presented, and the KCI took note of, the performance on key performance indicators for monitoring communication and outreach efforts of the KCI.

36. The KCI initiated the work to update its communication and outreach strategy and requested the working group to update the strategy, taking into account the comments received, with a view to finalizing it at KCI 15.

VIII. Mainstreaming gender considerations

37. The gender focal points of the KCI reported on progress in mainstreaming gender considerations in the work of the KCI, which included taking into account gender aspects in the ongoing work of the KCI on draft papers, ensuring gender balance of speakers at KCI

side events and of appointed experts, and establishing the informal network of experts on gender for response measures.¹²

38. The KCI took note of the information provided.

IX. Rules of Procedure of the Katowice Committee on Impacts

39. The KCI considered the suggestions for the revision of the current rules of procedure and agreed to continue consideration and finalize this matter at its fifteenth meeting.

X. Dates and venue of the 15th meeting of the Katowice Committee on Impacts

40. The secretariat shared the tentative dates and venue for KCI 15, and the KCI took note of the information provided.

XI. Other matters

41. There were no issues to be considered under other matters.

XII. Closure of the meeting

42. The Co-Chairs suspended the meeting on 5 June 2026 at 10.30 p.m. Central European Summer Time. The meeting was resumed on 11 June 2026 at 6:00 p.m. and was closed on the same day at 10.27 p.m. Central European Summer Time. The Co-Chairs thanked the KCI members and observers for their active participation.
