Outcome from the Preparatory Days

Global EW4All Multi-Stakeholder Forum



- EWS are effective when at-risk communities co-develop and co-own within an institutionalized chain of responsibility (Early Warnings by all). Tailoring EWS to user needs through a participatory approach empowers informed decision-making

World Resilient Recovery Conference (WRRC)



- Priority Actions to Enhance Resilient Recovery launched. This is a call to action to governments and partners to join hands in enhancing readiness for resilient recovery and to build back better.

Third Stakeholder Forum on DRR



- The Stakeholder Forum called for a shift from symbolic participation to genuine co-leadership by civil society—paired with integrated DRR-climate policies, locally driven digital governance, and financing that reaches frontline communities.

Better data to understand risk

- Use case driven
- Historical data, tracking of disasters & their impacts, and predictive analysis
- Localized and disaggregated data
- Data as public good

Use technology to leapfrog progress

- Closing the digital divide to the last mile
- AI-powered - open-data and open-source approaches
- Enhancing risk literacy and citizen science

Promote integrated risk governance

- Integrated DRR and climate action
- Address emerging risks, incl extreme heat
- Localization – data, multi-level governance and decentralized finance

Invest in prevention

- International, public and private finance for prevention
- Fast, traceable and accountable finance, tech transfer & capacity building, including Santiago network

Risk-inform all investments

- Risk information to guide public and private investments and financial frameworks
- Resilience standards & resilient business practices
- School safety – Multiplier impact of investment in education

- International support and national ownership for EW4All
- User-centred early warning designs
- Pre-arranged, risk-informed financial instruments

- Social cohesion & participatory governance

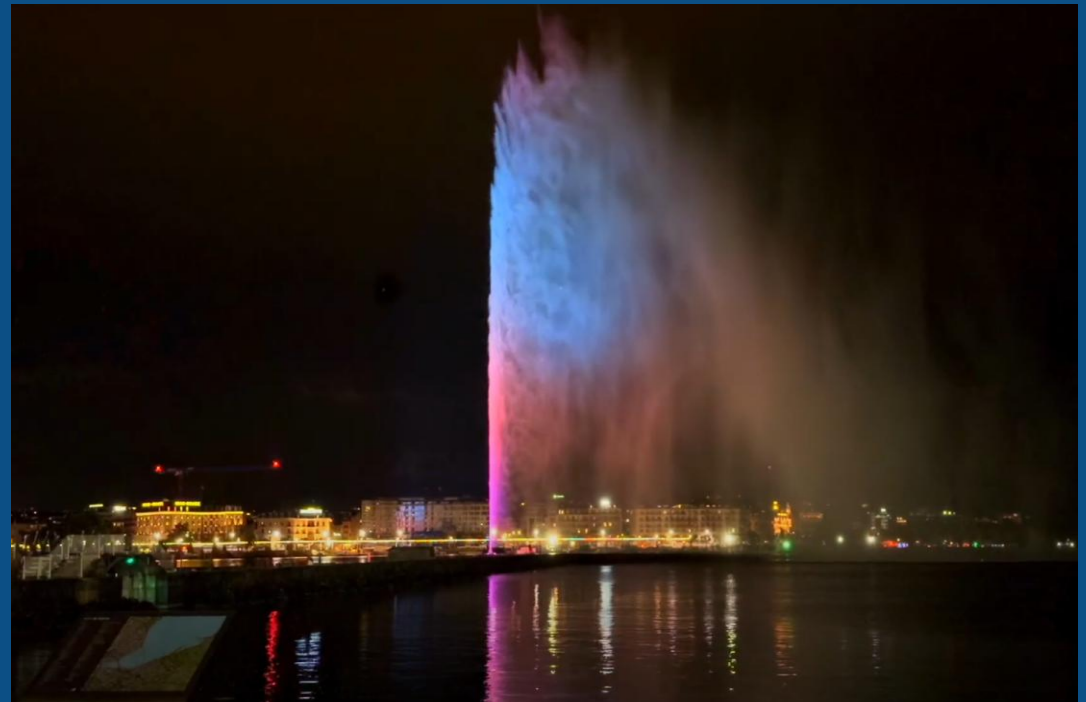
