Matters relating to the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures serving the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement

Draft conclusions proposed by the co-chairs

- 1. The Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) convened a meeting of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures at these sessions.
- 2. The SBSTA and the SBI welcomed the following mandated events held during SB 62:
- (a) Workshop on inclusive impact assessment of response measures integrating intergenerational equity, gender, youth, local communities, and Indigenous Peoples;¹
- (b) Technical event on experiences in economic diversification, workforce transition, and response measures impact assessment;²
- (c) Technical event on experiences in scientific assessment of the co-benefits of climate change policies and actions;³
- (d) Technical event on experiences in legislations, action plans and frameworks for economic diversification and just transition.⁴
- 3. The SBSTA and the SBI expressed appreciation to the experts, organizations and facilitators who contributed to the workshop and technical events mentioned in paragraph 2 above.

Option 2: The SBSTA and the SBI requested the KCI to prioritize the implementation of activities 2, 5, 6, 8, 10, 11 and 13 of the workplan of the forum and its KCI for 2026–2030¹⁰ and invited Parties and observers to submit via the submission portal¹¹ by 10 July 2025 views on timelines and modalities for the implementation of activities in the workplan of the forum and its KCI for consideration by the KCI in preparing a timeline and modalities for its the implementation of each activity in the workplan.¹²

- 7. The SBSTA and the SBI agreed to continue work on matters relating to the forum at SB 63 (November 2025), taking into account the informal note prepared by the co-chairs for this agenda item at these sessions available on the UNFCCC website, ¹³ with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption by the Conference of the Parties at its thirtieth session, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol at its twentieth session, and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its seventh session (November 2025).
- 8. The SBSTA and the SBI took note of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in paragraphs XX above.
- 9. They requested that the actions of the secretariat called for in these conclusions be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources.

Further request the forum, in line with the timeline and modalities included in the annual report of the KCI for 2025, to hold a policy discussion pertaining to an activity of the workplan at the sessions of the subsidiary bodies immediately following the delivery of the output of that activity by the KCI with a view to developing recommendations for consideration and adoption by the COP, the CMP and the CMA;

6. *Options for further global dialogues:*

Option 1: Decide that two two-day global dialogues on the impacts of the implementation of response measures shall be held each year, starting in 2026, with one to be held prior to the first regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies of the year and one in conjunction with intersessional meetings of the KCI, and that such dialogues should be conducted in hybrid format to allow for both in-person and virtual participation;

Option 1: The SBSTA and the SBI recalled the adoption of agenda of SB 62 and reaffirm that all related issues to promote international cooperation and address the concerns with climate change related trade-restrictive unilateral measures, will be discussed in all present and future relevant agenda items, including Just Transition work Programme.
