## TÜRKİYE'S PLENARY INTERVENTION ON NCQG

First of all, I would like to thank the Azerbaijan COP Presidency for hosting us. We are halfway through this critical decade.

In the remaining half of this decade, in order to deliver climate action aligned with 1.5 degree, this NCQG decision in Baku is crucial.

Yesterday we had a very productive meeting at the Heads of Delegation level.

It is encouraging to see possible areas of convergence. We appreciate the leadership of the COP29 Presidency on this issue.

In particular, the expectations of the most vulnerable developing countries, LDCs and SIDS, about climate finance are extremely important and vital.

Furthermore, if we want climate action aligned with the 1.5 degree, we need to build a system that will accelerate the transformation and increase the ambition of developing countries with emerging economies that have a high mitigation potential.

If we have no other option besides a multi-layered approach, the details of this need to be negotiated in a more technical setting.

If we are going to think outside the box, we need to build trust alongside an improved financial setting where everyone feels safe.

This approach will also potentially solve issues like quantum that seem to be locked up at the moment.

We must take this NCQG decision in Baku. A balanced and ambitious outcome will shape the conferences of the next five years.
