- Acknowledged the improved structure and design of its webpages, enhancing accessibility and user experience.





Quick facts (As of 29 August 2025)

64 developing country Parties, including 14 small island developing States and 22 least developed countries, have submitted their <u>national adaptation plans</u>, along with 10 developed countries;

72 Parties have submitted an <u>adaptation</u> <u>communication</u>, mostly as standalone documents:

154 out of 195 submitted <u>nationally</u> <u>determined contributions</u> include an adaptation component;

97 out of 112 submitted <u>biennial</u> <u>transparency reports</u> provide information on adaptation.

Adaptation Finance Quick Facts

As of 4 June 2025, the Green Climate Fund's overall portfolio is comprised of 297 projects, with a GCF funding amount of USD 16.7 billion and USD 46.5 billion in co-financing. Investment is mostly via grants (44%), followed by loans (40%) and equity (11%). A total of 59% of the funding amount in grant equivalent has been spent on adaptation projects. It is anticipated that GCF has increased the resilience of over 1 billion people.


Since 2010, the Adaptation Fund has allocated USD 1.39 billion to specifically support adaptation activities. This funding has facilitated the implementation of 199 targeted adaptation projects and the preservation or restoration of 728,250 hectares of natural habitats. These projects have collectively benefited approximately 45.8 million people in developing countries.

Since 2001, the Global Environment Facility has provided approximately USD 2.5 billion in grant financing and mobilized more than USD 14 billion from other sources through the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF). The funding has been channeled to 544 adaptation projects in the least developed countries, small island developing States and other vulnerable developing countries. These projects are working to directly reduce the vulnerability of more than 90 million people.






