Meditation room	A room for meditation and prayer is available to participants and is located on the second floor, to the right of the ESCAP Hall.
Webcasts of the sessions	Live and on-demand webcast coverage of official plenary sessions, press conferences as well as pre-session workshops will be provided during the Climate Change Conference Bangkok. Webcasts from official plenary sessions will be made available with English interpretation audio. PowerPoint presentations will be displayed and made available for download in PDF format when provided by the speaker.
