Cadre de référence de l'examen de 2019 du Mécanisme international de Varsovie relatif aux pertes et préjudices liés aux incidences des changements climatiques

Projet de conclusions proposé par les Présidents

1. Conformément à l'alinéa d) du paragraphe 2 de la décision 4/CP.22, l'Organe subsidiaire de mise en œuvre (SBI) et l'Organe subsidiaire de conseil scientifique et technologique (SBSTA) ont finalisé le mandat de l'examen de 2019 du Mécanisme international de Varsovie relatif aux pertes et préjudices liés aux incidences des changements climatiques.
2. Le SBI et le SBSTA sont convenus d'entreprendre l'examen à leur cinquante et unième session (décembre 2019) en tenant compte du cadre de référence énoncé dans l'annexe et de transmettre les résultats de l'examen à l'organe ou aux organes compétents¹.
3. Le SBI et le SBSTA ont invité les Parties et les autres parties prenantes à communiquer, par l'intermédiaire du portail prévu à cet effet², avant le 16 octobre, leurs vues sur l'examen du Mécanisme international de Varsovie en tenant compte du cadre de référence, dont ils seront saisis à leur cinquante et unième session.
4. Le SBI et le SBSTA ont pris note de l'estimation des incidences budgétaires de l'exécution par le secrétariat des activités prévues dans l'annexe et ont demandé que les activités du secrétariat prévues dans les présentes conclusions soient exécutées sous réserve de la disponibilité de ressources financières.

Annexe

Cadre de référence de l'examen de 2019 du Mécanisme international de Varsovie relatif aux pertes et préjudices liés aux incidences des changements climatiques

I. Mandate

1. Decision 4/CP.22 provides recommendations regarding the review of the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts.

II. Objective

2. By the same decision, the 2019 review will consider, inter alia, progress on the implementation of the workplan of the Executive Committee of the Warsaw International Mechanism, as well as its long-term vision that guides ways in which the Warsaw International Mechanism may be enhanced and strengthened, as appropriate.

III. Scope

3. Parties will review the Warsaw International Mechanism since its establishment in 2013, taking into account those segments of the population that are already vulnerable in accordance with decision 3/CP.18, paragraph 7(a)(iii).¹

4. The review will focus on, inter alia:

(a) The performance of the Warsaw International Mechanism and its functions as set out in decision 2/CP.19 and how it continues to promote the implementation of approaches to address loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change;

(b) The structure of the Warsaw International Mechanism;

(c) The usefulness and use of the outputs of the Warsaw International Mechanism, including for developing country Parties;

(d) Collaboration, coherence and partnerships with bodies, entities and work programmes, and with relevant stakeholders within and outside the Convention;

(e) The progress on the implementation of the workplan of the Executive Committee;

(f) The response of the Warsaw International Mechanism to relevant decisions and the Paris Agreement.²

5. In their assessment, Parties will consider:
 - (a) The effectiveness and efficiency of the Warsaw International Mechanism, including timeliness, relevance, usefulness, visibility, coherence, complementarity, comprehensiveness, responsiveness and resourcing;
 - (b) Barriers and gaps, challenges and opportunities, and lessons learned.

IV. Inputs and sources of information

6. Being guided by the best available science, the inputs to the review are as follows:
 - (a) The technical paper on sources of and modalities for accessing financial support, as provided through and outside the Financial Mechanism, for addressing loss and damage,³ as referred to in paragraph 2(f) of decision 4/CP.22;
 - (b) The annual reports of and outputs by the Executive Committee and the reports of its substructures;⁴
 - (c) Views relevant to the Warsaw International Mechanism submitted by Parties referred to in paragraph 3 of this document and previous submissions on the review of the Warsaw International Mechanism;
 - (d) The workplan of the Executive Committee;
 - (e) Relevant decisions and the Paris Agreement.
7. Sources of information for the review may include:
 - (a) Relevant scientific and technical reports of national, regional and international organizations;
 - (b) Relevant national and regional strategies, plans and reports;
 - (c) Relevant outputs of constituted bodies and from events organized under the UNFCCC process;
 - (d) Views relevant to the Warsaw International Mechanism submitted by other stakeholders.

V. Modalities

8. The modalities to be used in conducting the review are:
 - (a) The calls for the submissions referred to in paragraph 6(c) above;
 - (b) An event to be held in conjunction with the fifty-first sessions of the subsidiary bodies (December 2019) and organized by the secretariat under the guidance of the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies;
 - (c) The undertaking of the review by the subsidiary bodies, which will be informed by, inter alia, the above-mentioned event.

VI. Expected output

9. On the basis of the assessment of progress undertaken in accordance with paragraphs 1–8 above, a draft decision will be prepared at SB 51, including a set of
