II. Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the session

1. SBI 62 will be opened by the SBI Chair, Julia Gardiner (Australia), on 16 June 2025.

2. Organizational matters

(a) Adoption of the agenda

2. The provisional agenda, prepared by the secretariat in agreement with the SBI Chair, will be presented for adoption.

(b) Election of officers other than the Chair

3. *Background:* The SBI shall elect its Vice-Chair and Rapporteur for 2025. The current Vice-Chair, Gonzalo Guaiquil (Chile), and Rapporteur, Ayşin Turpanci (Türkiye), will remain in office until their successors are elected. Parties are encouraged to actively consider nominating women for elective posts.

4. When the SBI exercises its functions with regard to matters concerning the Kyoto Protocol, any member of its Bureau representing a State that is a Party to the Convention but at that time not a Party to the Kyoto Protocol shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from among the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol. This applies mutatis mutandis to the SBI exercising its functions with regard to matters concerning the Paris Agreement.

5. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to elect its Vice-Chair and Rapporteur for 2025.

(c) Organization of the work of the session

6. SBI 62 will be held in parallel with SBSTA 62. Detailed information on the organization of the work of the session will be made available on the session web page.³ Delegates are invited to refer to the overview schedule⁴ and the in-session Daily Programme⁵ and to regularly consult the screens at the venue and the virtual conference platform for up-to-date information on the work of the SBI. To maximize negotiation time and ensure timely closure of the sessions, the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies will propose, in consultation with Parties and in a transparent manner, time-saving approaches to the organization and scheduling of meetings during the sessions, taking into account previous relevant SBI conclusions.⁶ In this context, the Chairs will propose cut-off times for group work and deadlines for the submission of conclusions so that they can be made available in all six official languages of the United Nations for the closing plenaries.

7. The Chairs of the subsidiary bodies will issue, under their own responsibility, a joint note in advance of SB 62 that will suggest an approach to the work and include guidance on working efficiently, effectively and transparently during the sessions.

(d) Facilitative sharing of views

8. The eighteenth facilitative sharing of views under the international consultation and analysis process for BURs under the SBI⁷ will be convened at this session for non-Annex I Parties that submitted a BUR and for which a summary report will be finalized by 10 April 2025. It will take the form of a workshop open to all Parties. Interested Parties may submit written questions in advance.

(e) Facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress

10. The facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress is undertaken with respect to a Party's efforts under Article 9 of the Paris Agreement and the Party's implementation and achievement of its nationally determined contribution. The facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress will build upon the experience gained under the Convention through the multilateral assessment and facilitative sharing of views processes. The first working group session for the facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress, organized for three Parties, will be held during SBI 62.

3. Reporting from and review of Parties included in Annex I to the Convention

(a) Compilations and syntheses of biennial reports

14. *Background:* The secretariat prepares compilation and synthesis reports on the information reported by Annex I Parties in their biennial reports.¹¹ The SBI considered the report on information from the fifth biennial reports at SBI 59, 60 and 61.¹² At SBI 61, Parties agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBI 62.¹³

15. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter.

(b) Reports on national greenhouse gas inventory data

16. *Background:* The secretariat prepares an annual report containing the latest information on greenhouse gas inventory data submitted by Annex I Parties for consideration by the COP and its subsidiary bodies.¹⁴ SBI 61 considered the 2023 report and the 2024 report, and Parties agreed to continue consideration at SBI 62.¹⁵

17. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter.

18. *Background:* At SBI 61, Parties engaged in constructive discussions on the information contained in national communications from non-Annex I Parties and agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBI 62.¹⁶

(b) Provision of financial and technical support

20. *Background:* Financial and technical support provided to developing countries for implementing the measurement, reporting and verification arrangements under the Convention includes funding from the Global Environment Facility, which regularly reports on its activities relating to the preparation of national communications and BURs, and from the CBIT–GSP, and technical support provided by the secretariat.

21. Since SBI 61 could not conclude consideration of this matter, in accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied the matter has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.¹⁷

22. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter.

(d) Term, composition and terms of reference of the Consultative Group of Experts

25. *Background:* COP 26 requested SBI 62 to initiate consideration of the extension of the term of the CGE beyond 2026, the composition of the CGE and its terms of reference, taking into account the needs of developing countries for capacity-building in relation to reporting under the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement.¹⁸

26. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 30.

5. Reporting and review pursuant to Article 13 of the Paris Agreement: provision of financial and technical support to developing country Parties for reporting and capacity-building

27. *Background:* CMA 5 invited Parties to submit information on their experience and challenges related to implementing Article 13 of the Paris Agreement, including in relation to establishing or enhancing their institutional capacity and national reporting systems.¹⁹

28. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter, including the synthesis report and facilitative dialogue,²⁰ with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.

6. Matters relating to the global stocktake

(a) Procedural and logistical elements of the overall global stocktake process*

29. *Background:* CMA 5 welcomed the conclusion of the first global stocktake.²¹ It recalled the decision taken at CMA 1 to consider refining the procedural and logistical elements of the overall global stocktake process on the basis of experience from the first global stocktake²² and decided that such consideration shall commence at SB 60 and conclude at CMA 6.²³ SB 61 agreed to forward this matter to CMA 6 for consideration.²⁴

30. CMA 6 requested the subsidiary bodies to continue consideration of this matter at SB 62 on the basis of the informal note, which includes a compilation annex, available on the UNFCCC website²⁵ with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.²⁶

31. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter on the basis of the informal note referred to in paragraph 30 above with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.

(b) Modalities of the United Arab Emirates dialogue on implementing the global stocktake outcomes, referred to in paragraph 97 of decision 1/CMA.5

32. *Background:* CMA 5 decided to establish the United Arab Emirates dialogue on implementing the global stocktake outcomes, to be operationalized starting from CMA 6 and conclude at CMA 10, and requested SBI 60 to develop the modalities for the dialogue for consideration at CMA 6.²⁷ SBI 60 initiated deliberations on the modalities and Parties agreed to continue consideration thereof at SBI 61.²⁸ SBI 61 agreed to forward this matter to CMA 6 for consideration.²⁹

33. CMA 6 requested SBI 62 to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.³⁰

34. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.

7. Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme*

35. *Background:* CMA 3 established a work programme for urgently scaling up mitigation ambition and implementation in this critical decade.³¹

36. CMA 5 requested the subsidiary bodies to consider progress in implementing the work programme at each of their sessions from SB 60 to 65.³² At SB 61, Parties could not conclude consideration of this matter.³³

37. CMA 6 noted the discussion at that session regarding the creation of a digital platform to facilitate implementation of mitigation actions by enhancing collaboration between governments, financiers and other stakeholders on developing investable projects in a country-owned and nationally determined manner and invited Parties, observers and other stakeholders to submit by 1 May 2025 views on the design and features of the platform with a view to an exchange of views on the platform taking place at SB 62.³⁴

38. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to consider progress in implementing the work programme.

8. United Arab Emirates just transition work programme*

39. *Background:* CMA 4 established a work programme on just transition for discussion of pathways to achieving the goals of the Paris Agreement outlined in Article 2, paragraph 1, in the context of Article 2, paragraph 2.³⁵

40. CMA 5 decided that the subsidiary bodies shall guide the implementation of the work programme through a joint contact group to be convened at each of their sessions, starting at SB 60, with a view to them recommending a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption by the CMA at each of its sessions.³⁶

41. At SB 60, Parties agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SB 61 taking note of the informal note prepared by the co-chairs of the work programme for the agenda items at SB 60,³⁷ the exchanges of views and inputs by Parties under the agenda items at those sessions, views submitted no later than four weeks prior to SB 61 and the annual summary report on the dialogues.³⁸

42. At SB 61, Parties could not conclude consideration of this matter and agreed to forward it to CMA 6 for further consideration.³⁹

43. CMA 6 requested SB 62 to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.⁴⁰

44. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.

9. Matters relating to the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures serving the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement*

45. *Background:* COP 25, CMP 15 and CMA 2 adopted the workplan of the forum and its KCI.⁴¹

46. COP 28, CMP 18 and CMA 5 requested the forum and its KCI to implement the activities arising from the outcomes of the midterm review of the workplan.⁴²

47. COP 29, CMP 19 and CMA 6 adopted the workplan of the forum and its KCI for 2026–2030.⁴³

48. COP 29, CMP 19 and CMA 6 requested the KCI to prepare and include in its annual report for 2025 a timeline and modalities for its implementation of each activity in the workplan referred to in paragraph 47 above and the forum to incorporate into its annual workplan the consideration of matters of process and substantive matters related to the work of the KCI at the sessions of the governing bodies on the basis of the annual report of the KCI.⁴⁴

49. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to convene the forum with a view to recommending a draft decision on these matters for consideration and adoption at COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7.

10. Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security*

50. *Background:* COP 27 decided to establish the Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security.⁴⁵

51. SB 60 requested the secretariat to prepare the annual synthesis report referred to in paragraph 15(a) of decision [3/CP.27](#) available for consideration at the first regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year, starting in 2025, noting that the first annual synthesis report, to be prepared for consideration at SB 62, should cover the period starting from 2013 in order to encompass the implementation of the outcomes of the Koronivia joint work on agriculture and previous activities.⁴⁶

52. SB 60 requested the secretariat to hold in-session workshops under the joint work in hybrid format and invited Parties and observers to submit for each workshop views on the subject of that workshop, options for its format and suggested speakers.⁴⁷

53. SB 61 requested the secretariat to further develop the Sharm el-Sheikh online portal to enable submissions to be further categorized by project, initiative or policy and to develop by SB 62 a template for submissions to the portal, and invited Parties and observers to use the template when making submissions to the portal.⁴⁸

54. SB 61 requested the secretariat to further develop the structure, functionalities and accessibility of the online portal, taking into account the key points from Parties'

56. *Background:* CMA 6 requested the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies to invite the technical experts⁵⁰ to commence their work on further refining the indicators, produce a consolidated list of indicator options for Parties and a progress report, to be published no later than four weeks prior to SB 62 for consideration at those sessions, and finalize and submit their inputs to the technical reports in time to enable the issuance of the reports, and requested the secretariat to publish the relevant outputs prior to SB 62.⁵¹

57. SB 60 agreed to take stock of the work under the United Arab Emirates–Belém work programme, including the assessment of areas not covered by existing indicators and, as needed, the development of new indicators, at SB 61, 62 and 63 with a view to informing a decision on the work programme at CMA 7.⁵²

58. At SB 60, Parties agreed to continue considering the nature of the final outcome of the United Arab Emirates–Belém work programme at SB 61 and 62.^{53, 54}

59. CMA 6 requested the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies to organize a hybrid workshop under the United Arab Emirates–Belém work programme, to take place prior to SB 62, to facilitate the work of the technical experts, and requested the secretariat to prepare and publish a summary report on the workshop no later than six weeks prior to SB 62.⁵⁵ The workshop took place in Bonn from 21 to 22 March 2025.

60. CMA 6 decided to launch the Baku Adaptation Road Map and requested the subsidiary bodies to develop modalities for work under the Road Map.⁵⁶ It invited Parties to submit views on matters related to paragraph 38 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and on the modalities for work under the Baku Adaptation Road Map.⁵⁷

61. CMA 6 requested SB 62 to continue consideration of paragraph 38 of decision [2/CMA.5](#).⁵⁸

62. CMA 6 took note of the technical paper prepared by the secretariat on transformational adaptation,⁵⁹ and requested the subsidiary bodies to continue consideration thereof at SB 62 and the secretariat to prepare a reader-friendly summary thereof and make it available in all six official languages of the United Nations.⁶⁰

63. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of these matters.

(b) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee*

64. *Background:* COP 27 was to review the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee,⁶¹ and COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review as it relates to the Paris Agreement.⁶²

65. COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.⁶³ The subsidiary bodies considered the review at SB 58, 59 and 60.⁶⁴ At SB 61, Parties agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SB 62.⁶⁵

66. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 30 and CMA 7.

(c) National adaptation plans

67. *Background:* COP 26 requested SBI 60 to initiate the assessment of progress in the process to formulate and implement national adaptation plans⁶⁶ and decided on the actions and steps necessary for the SBI to initiate the assessment.⁶⁷

68. SBI 60 initiated the assessment referred to in paragraph 67 above and Parties decided to continue consideration of this matter at SBI 61.⁶⁸ SBI 61 agreed to forward this matter to COP 29 for consideration.⁶⁹ COP 29 requested SBI 62 to continue consideration of the matter

70. *Background:* Article 7, paragraph 10, of the Paris Agreement provides that each Party should, as appropriate, submit and update periodically an adaptation communication, which may include its priorities, implementation and support needs, plans and actions, without creating any additional burden for developing country Parties.

71. CMA 1 invited Parties to submit information on their experience with the application of the guidance contained in decision [9/CMA.1](#) and requested the secretariat to prepare a synthesis report on those submissions for consideration at SBI 62.⁷²

72. CMA 1 decided to take stock of, and if necessary revise, the guidance contained in decision [9/CMA.1](#) taking into account the submissions and the synthesis report referred to in paragraph 71 above at CMA 7.⁷³

73. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.

76. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the work of the LEG and to take further action, as appropriate.

13. Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts

- (a) Joint annual report of the Executive Committee of the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts and the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change for 2024*

77. *Background:* COP 19 and 20 requested the WIM Executive Committee to report annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies and to make recommendations, as appropriate.⁷⁵

78. CMA 4 decided that the report of the Santiago network is to be prepared by its secretariat, approved by its Advisory Board, included in a joint annual report of the Santiago network and the Executive Committee and submitted to the governing body or bodies through their subsidiary bodies.⁷⁶

79. CMA 6 welcomed the progress of the Executive Committee in implementing its rolling workplan for 2023–2027⁷⁷ and the progress in operationalizing the Santiago network, and requested SB 62 to continue consideration of the 2024 joint annual report of the Executive Committee and the Santiago network.⁷⁸

80. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of the 2024 joint annual report referred to in paragraph 79 above with a view to recommending a draft decision or decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption by the appropriate body or bodies at the session(s) to be held in November 2025.

81. *Background:* COP 22 recommended that future reviews of the WIM consider, inter alia, progress in the implementation of the workplan of the WIM Executive Committee as well as the long-term vision that guides how the WIM may be enhanced and strengthened, as appropriate.⁷⁹

82. CMA 2 recommended that a review of the WIM be held in 2024 and every five years thereafter.⁸⁰

83. SB 60 finalized the terms of reference for the 2024 review,⁸¹ invited Parties and non-Party stakeholders to submit views and other inputs to the review, and requested the secretariat to prepare a summary thereof and a background paper to inform the review.⁸²

84. At SB 61, Parties could not conclude consideration of this matter.⁸³ CMA 6 requested SB 62 to continue consideration of the 2024 review of the WIM.⁸⁴

85. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of the 2024 review with a view to recommending a draft decision or decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption by the appropriate body or bodies at the session(s) to be held in November 2025.

94. *Background:* CMA 5 decided to establish a technology implementation programme and invited SBI 61 to take into account the technology implementation programme in its consideration of the Poznan strategic programme on technology transfer with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 6.⁹¹

95. CMA 6 decided to launch a process for elaborating the technology implementation programme.⁹²

96. CMA 6 requested SBI 62 to consider this matter on the basis of the results of Parties’ deliberations thereon at CMA 6, as contained in the draft text available on the UNFCCC website,⁹³ with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at CMA 7 with a view to informing and further elaborating the technology implementation programme.⁹⁴

97. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 7.

and to forward a recommendation for consideration at CMP 17.⁹⁵ CMA 4 reiterated paragraph 7 of decision 3/CMP.16, which confirms that Parties to the Paris Agreement are eligible for membership on the Board and requested SBI 58 to continue consideration of this matter, as needed, in view of the Adaptation Fund's transition to exclusively serving the Paris Agreement.⁹⁶ At SBI 58 and 59, Parties deferred consideration of this matter to subsequent sessions respectively.⁹⁷ At SBI 60, Parties could not conclude consideration of this matter⁹⁸ and, at SBI 61, Parties agreed to defer consideration of this matter to SBI 62.⁹⁹

99. CMP 6 decided to undertake the review of the Adaptation Fund at CMP 7 and every three years thereafter.¹⁰⁰ CMP 17 requested SBI 62 to initiate the fifth review of the Adaptation Fund in accordance with the terms of reference contained in the annex to decision 4/CMP.16, or as amended, and to report back to its governing bodies at the sessions to be convened in conjunction with COP 31.¹⁰¹

100. CMP 19 and CMA 6 requested SBI 62 to consider the matter of the arrangements for the Adaptation Fund to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement and to make recommendations on this matter for consideration at CMP 20 and CMA 7 respectively.¹⁰²

101. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of the membership of the Adaptation Fund Board and to consider the arrangements for the Adaptation Fund to exclusively serving the Paris Agreement, with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at CMP 20 and CMA 7. The SBI will also be invited to initiate the fifth review of the Adaptation Fund with a view to reporting back to its governing bodies at the sessions to be convened in conjunction with COP 31.

16. Matters relating to capacity-building

102. *Background:* To assist the SBI in its annual monitoring of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in developing countries established under decision 2/CP.7,¹⁰³ the secretariat prepared a synthesis report on the implementation of the capacity-building framework¹⁰⁴ and a compilation and synthesis report on the capacity-building work of bodies established under the Convention and its Kyoto Protocol.¹⁰⁵

103. COP 29 requested the secretariat to prepare a technical report on the basis of the submissions¹⁰⁶ and several information sources,¹⁰⁷ for consideration at SBI 62.¹⁰⁸

104. COP 29 also requested SBI 62 to initiate the fifth comprehensive review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in developing countries, in accordance with the terms of reference contained in the annex to decision 11/CP.29.

105. CMP 16 requested SBI 62 to develop terms of reference for the fifth comprehensive review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in developing countries established under decision 2/CP.7, for consideration and adoption at CMP 20.¹⁰⁹

17. Arrangements for intergovernmental meetings

107. *Background:* In order to make the necessary arrangements for intergovernmental meetings and to enhance observer engagement in the UNFCCC process, the secretariat regularly seeks guidance from the SBI under this agenda item.

108. COP 29 requested SBI 62 to consider the issue of the host of COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8 and to recommend a draft decision on the matter for consideration and adoption at COP 30.¹¹⁰

109. SBI 60 noted that, in keeping with the principle of rotation among the United Nations regional groups, the President of COP 31 would come from the Western European and other States and urged the Western European and other States to accelerate their consultations with a view to presenting an offer to host COP 31 as soon as possible and no later than at SBI 62 in order to facilitate timely planning.¹¹¹

110. SBI 60 invited Parties and observer organizations to submit views on increasing efficiency in the UNFCCC process, including streamlining the agendas of the governing and subsidiary bodies, and requested the secretariat to prepare an information paper that includes visualizing the operationalization of the options contained in the submissions and a technical paper produced for SBI 60,¹¹² as well as the submissions from Parties and observer organizations requested at that session, for consideration at SBI 62.¹¹³

111. SBI 60 requested the secretariat to report back to SBI 62 on the follow-up in relation to the meaningful engagement of observer organizations in the UNFCCC process and to explore further technical measures to facilitate the engagement of a broad range of observer organizations in sessions in the face of the increasing number of admitted observer organizations, subject to the availability of financial resources.¹¹⁴

112. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision on the relevant matters, as appropriate, for consideration and adoption at COP 30.

18. Gender and climate change

113. *Background:* COP 29 decided to extend the enhanced Lima work programme on gender for 10 years.¹¹⁵

114. COP 29 requested SBI 62 to initiate the development of a new gender action plan taking into account the inputs to and outcome of the review of the enhanced Lima work programme on gender and its gender action plan in 2024 and the technical workshop that the Chair of the SBI was requested to organize at SB 62, with the support of the secretariat, to facilitate the design of gender action plan activities at SB 62, with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at COP 30.¹¹⁶

115. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 30.
