I. Opening of the session

(Agenda item 1)

1. The sixty-third session of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) was held at the Hangar Convention and Fair Centre of the Amazon in Belém, Brazil, from 10 to 15 November 2025.
2. The Chair of the SBI, Julia Gardiner (Australia), opened the session and welcomed all Parties and observers. She also welcomed Eyad Aljubran (Saudi Arabia) as Vice-Chair and Kamil Salazar (Belize) as Rapporteur.

3. At its 1st meeting, on 10 November, the SBI considered a note by the Executive Secretary containing the provisional agenda.¹ Following consultations with Parties on the adoption of the agendas for SB 63, the Chair proposed that the provisional agenda for this session be amended to add a footnote to SBI 63 agenda item 9 and agenda item 8 of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) at its sixty-third session, United Arab Emirates just transition work programme, that replicates footnote 7 from the report on SBI 62, found in document FCCC/SBI/2025/11, and footnote 7 from the report on SBSTA 62, found in document FCCC/SBSTA/2025/4.
