II. Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the session

1. SBI 64 will be opened by the SBI Chair, Julia Gardiner (Australia), on 8 June 2026.

2. Organizational matters

(a) Adoption of the agenda

2. The provisional agenda, prepared by the secretariat in agreement with the SBI Chair, will be presented for adoption.

(b) Election of officers other than the Chair

3. *Background:* The SBI shall elect its Vice-Chair and Rapporteur for 2026. The current Vice-Chair, Eyad Aljubran (Saudi Arabia), and Rapporteur, Kamil Salazar (Belize), will remain in office until their successors are elected. Parties are invited to recall decision [3/CP.23](#) and actively consider nominating women.

4. When the SBI exercises its functions with regard to matters concerning the Kyoto Protocol, any member of its Bureau representing a State that is a Party to the Convention but at that time not a Party to the Kyoto Protocol shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from among the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol. This applies mutatis mutandis to the SBI exercising its functions with regard to matters concerning the Paris Agreement.

5. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to elect its Vice-Chair and Rapporteur for 2026.

(c) Organization of the work of the session

6. SBI 64 will be held in parallel with SBSTA 64. Information on the organization of the work of the session will be made available on the session web page.³ Delegates are invited to refer to the overview schedule⁴ and the in-session Daily Programme⁵ and to regularly consult the screens at the venue and the virtual conference platform for up-to-date information on the work of the SBI. To maximize negotiation time and ensure timely closure of the sessions, the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies will propose, in consultation with Parties and in a transparent manner, time-saving approaches to the organization and scheduling of meetings during the sessions, taking into account previous relevant SBI conclusions.⁶ In this context, the Chairs will propose cut-off times for group work and deadlines for the submission of conclusions so that they can be made available in all six official languages of the United Nations for the closing plenaries.

7. The Chairs of the subsidiary bodies will issue, under their own responsibility, a joint note in advance of SB 64 that will include a proposed approach to the work and guidance on working efficiently, effectively and transparently during the sessions.

(d) Facilitative sharing of views

8. The twentieth facilitative sharing of views under the SBI,⁷ in the form of a workshop open to all Parties, will be convened at this session for Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention that submitted a BUR and for which a summary report will be finalized by 3 April 2026. Parties may submit written questions in advance.

9. The records of the facilitative sharing of views for the participating Parties will be made available on the UNFCCC website.

(e) Facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress

10. The facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress is undertaken with respect to a Party's efforts under Article 9 of the Paris Agreement and the Party's implementation and achievement of its nationally determined contribution,⁸ building on the experience gained under the Convention through the multilateral assessment and facilitative sharing of views processes. The third working group session for the facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress, organized for 37 Parties, will be held at this session.⁹ Any Party may submit written questions to the Party concerned.¹⁰

11. The records of the facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress for the participating Parties will be made available on the UNFCCC website.

(iii) Technical session to determine the information to be provided for the technical assessment component of the second global stocktake;

(iv) Technical session to build awareness of and share information related to analysing, assessing and reporting on the impacts of measures taken to combat climate change, including cross-border impacts, recalling Article 3, paragraph 5, of the Convention.

3. Reporting from and review of Parties included in Annex I to the Convention

(a) Compilations and syntheses of biennial reports

14. *Background:* The secretariat prepares compilation and synthesis reports on the information reported by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention in their biennial reports.¹³ SBI 59, 60, 61 and 62 considered the compilation and synthesis of fifth biennial reports.¹⁴ SBI 62 agreed that this matter would be included in the provisional agenda for SBI 63 on the understanding that the sub-item would be held in abeyance.¹⁵ The sub-item was held in abeyance at SBI 63.

15. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.

(b) Report on national greenhouse gas inventory data

16. *Background:* The secretariat prepares an annual report containing the latest information on greenhouse gas inventory data submitted by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention for consideration by the COP and its subsidiary bodies.¹⁶ SBI 63 considered the 2025 report and agreed to defer consideration of this matter to SBI 64.¹⁷

17. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter.

4. Reporting from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention

(a) Information contained in national communications

18. *Background:* SBI 62 considered the information contained in national communications from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention and agreed that this

matter would be included in the provisional agenda for SBI 63 on the understanding that the sub-item would be held in abeyance.¹⁸ The sub-item was held in abeyance at SBI 63.

19. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.

(b) Provision of financial and technical support

20. *Background:* Financial and technical support provided to developing country Parties for implementing the measurement, reporting and verification arrangements under the Convention includes funding from the Global Environment Facility, which regularly reports on its activities relating to the preparation of national communications and BURs, and from the CBIT–GSP, and technical support provided by the secretariat.

21. SBI 63 agreed that consideration of this matter, including the frequency of including this matter in the agenda for future sessions of the SBI, will continue at SBI 64.¹⁹

22. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter.

23. *Background:* Thirty-three rounds of technical analysis covering 180 BURs had been conducted as at 23 March 2026. Planning for future rounds of technical analysis is subject to the availability of supplementary resources.

24. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of the published summary reports on the technical analysis of BURs.

5. Reporting and review pursuant to Article 13 of the Paris Agreement: provision of financial and technical support to developing country Parties for reporting and capacity-building

25. *Background:* CMA 7 requested the secretariat to conduct a survey to gather information from Parties about the benefits and outcomes of and lessons learned from the implementation of activities mandated in decisions [18/CMA.5](#) and [21/CMA.6](#), and to prepare a report on the survey.²⁰

26. CMA 7 also requested the secretariat to invite Parties to submit views on experience and challenges related to implementing Article 13 of the Paris Agreement and further requested the secretariat to prepare a synthesis report on submissions received, as well as on information reported in developing country Parties’ biennial transparency reports.²¹

27. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter taking into account the report on the survey and the synthesis report referred to in paragraphs 25–26 above.²²

6. Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme*

28. *Background:* CMA 3 established a work programme for urgently scaling up mitigation ambition and implementation in this critical decade.²³

29. CMA 5 requested the subsidiary bodies to consider progress in implementing the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme at each of their sessions from SB 60 to 65.²⁴

30. CMA 7 recalled paragraph 5 of decision [4/CMA.4](#), in which it was decided that implementation of the work programme will continue until CMA 8 with a view to a decision on the continuation of the work programme being adopted at that session, and invited Parties, observers and other stakeholders to submit views by 15 April 2026 on opportunities, best practices, actionable solutions, challenges and barriers relevant to the continuation, functioning and effectiveness of the work programme with a view to an exchange of views taking place at SB 64.²⁵

31. The President of CMA 7 noted that decision [13/CMA.7](#) as adopted allows for further work, and CMA 7 requested SB 64 to conduct such work on the basis of the work undertaken at CMA 7.²⁶

32. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to consider progress in implementing the work programme and the continuation thereof.

7. United Arab Emirates just transition work programme*

33. *Background:* CMA 4 established a work programme on just transition for discussion of pathways to achieving the goals of the Paris Agreement outlined in Article 2, paragraph 1, in the context of Article 2, paragraph 2.²⁷

34. CMA 5 decided that the subsidiary bodies shall guide the implementation of the United Arab Emirates just transition work programme through a joint contact group to be convened at each of their sessions with a view to them recommending a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption by the CMA at each of its sessions.²⁸

35. CMA 7 decided to develop a just transition mechanism and requested SB 64 to recommend a draft decision on the process for its operationalization for consideration at CMA 8. CMA 7 invited Parties and non-Party stakeholders to submit views on this process.²⁹

36. CMA 7 recalled paragraph 3 of decision [3/CMA.5](#), in which it was agreed to review the effectiveness and efficiency of the work programme and consider its continuation at

CMA 8, and requested SB 64 to develop terms of reference for the review, and to consider, inter alia, ways to improve existing modalities in developing the terms of reference, without prejudice to the outcome of the consideration of the continuation of the work programme.³⁰

37. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of the matters referred to in paragraphs 34–36 above with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.

8. Matters relating to the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures serving the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement*

38. *Background:* COP 29, CMP 19 and CMA 6 adopted the workplan for 2026–2030.³¹

39. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 requested the forum and its KCI to implement the workplan for 2026–2030 and make recommendations to the governing bodies consistent with the functions of the forum and its KCI.³²

40. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 decided that forum will conduct the activities referred to in paragraph 10 of decisions [6/CP.30](#), [2/CMP.20](#) and [14/CMA.7](#) at SB 64.³³

41. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to convene the forum with a view to recommending a draft decision on matters relating to the forum for consideration and adoption at COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8.

9. Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security*

42. *Background:* COP 27 decided to establish the Sharm el-Sheikh joint work.³⁴

43. SB 60 requested the secretariat to prepare the annual synthesis report referred to in paragraph 15(a) of decision [3/CP.27](#) and make it available for consideration at the first regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year.³⁵

44. SB 62 requested the secretariat to provide an update at SB 64 on the usage of and traffic to the Sharm el-Sheikh online portal developed by the secretariat.³⁶

45. SB 63 agreed that consideration of this matter will continue at SB 64 taking into account the draft text³⁷ prepared for these agenda items at SB 63.³⁸

46. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to determining next steps.

10. Matters relating to adaptation

(a) Global goal on adaptation*

47. *Background:* CMA 7 concluded the United Arab Emirates–Belém work programme on indicators for measuring progress achieved towards the targets referred to in paragraphs 9–10 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and adopted the Belém Adaptation Indicators.³⁹

48. CMA 7 decided to establish the Belém–Addis vision on adaptation, which comprises a two-year policy alignment process by Parties, based on the experience referred to in paragraphs 11–12 of decision [12/CMA.7](#) and the technical work referred to in paragraph 49 below, aimed at developing guidance for operationalizing the Belém Adaptation Indicators under the vision, and agreed that work under the vision will be carried out jointly by the subsidiary bodies.⁴⁰

49. CMA 7 requested the subsidiary bodies to undertake technical work on improving metadata and methodologies for the Belém Adaptation Indicators, to be considered at CMA 9, including by establishing a technical task force to contribute to that work.⁴¹

50. The President of CMA 7 noted that decision [12/CMA.7](#) as adopted allows for further work, and CMA 7 requested SB 64 to conduct such work on the basis of the work undertaken at CMA 7.⁴²

51. CMA 7 decided that the first phase of the Baku Adaptation Road Map, covering 2026–2028, shall focus on initial implementation of activities under the Road Map, consisting of the organization of two workshops per year convened by the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies with the support of the secretariat, and the preparation of a technical paper by the secretariat, aimed at enhancing adaptive capacity, strengthening cooperation and facilitating adaptation planning and implementation in line with different national circumstances and in the context of Article 2, paragraph 1(a), of the Paris Agreement.⁴³

52. CMA 7 also decided that the subsidiary bodies will develop and agree in 2026–2027 the terms of reference for the review of the United Arab Emirates Framework for Global Climate Resilience, which will include the review of the Belém Adaptation Indicators.⁴⁴

53. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter.

(b) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee*

54. *Background:* COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee, mandated to take place at COP 27, as it relates to the Paris Agreement.⁴⁵

55. COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.⁴⁶ SB 58, 59, 60, 61 and 62 continued consideration of the review.⁴⁷ SB 63 agreed to defer consideration of this matter to SB 64.⁴⁸

56. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

(c) Guidance relating to adaptation communications

57. *Background:* Article 7, paragraph 10, of the Paris Agreement provides that each Party should, as appropriate, submit and update periodically an adaptation communication, which may include its priorities, implementation and support needs, plans and actions, without creating any additional burden for developing country Parties.

58. The CMA decided to take stock of, and if necessary revise, the guidance contained in decision [9/CMA.1](#) in 2025 taking into account submissions received from Parties in response to the invitation to provide information on their experience with the application of that guidance⁴⁹ and a synthesis report thereon.^{50, 51}

59. CMA 7 noted that a limited number of Parties and groups of Parties submitted information in response to the invitation to provide information on their experience with the application of the guidance contained in decision [9/CMA.1](#)⁵² and invited SBI 64 to continue consideration of the timing to initiate the following actions: inviting Parties to submit further information on their experience with the application of the guidance contained in decision [9/CMA.1](#); requesting the secretariat to prepare a synthesis report on those submissions for consideration by the SBI; and taking stock of, and if necessary revising, the guidance contained in decision [9/CMA.1](#) taking into account the aforementioned submissions and synthesis report.⁵³

60. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to agreeing on draft conclusions or recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 8, as appropriate.

61. *Background:* The LEG is mandated to develop a two-year rolling programme of work for consideration by the SBI at its first regular session of each year and to report on its work

to the SBI at each of its sessions.⁵⁴ SBI 62 welcomed the work programme⁵⁵ of the LEG for 2025–2026.⁵⁶

62. SBI 63 considered the steps for the stocktake of the work of the LEG mandated to take place at COP 31 and CMA 8, the midway point before the review of the mandate of the LEG at COP 36.⁵⁷

63. COP 30 requested the secretariat to prepare a synthesis report on the progress of the work of the LEG, taking into account the submissions referred to in paragraph 17 of decision [15/CP.30](#) and other relevant sources of information, for consideration at SBI 64.⁵⁸

64. COP 30 also requested SBI 64 to initiate the stocktake of the progress of the work of the LEG and its terms of reference with a focus on the evolving needs of the least developed countries, taking into account the information in the synthesis report referred to in paragraph 63 above and to recommend a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 31.⁵⁹ CMA 7 requested SBI 64 to recommend a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.⁶⁰

65. The 49th meeting of the LEG took place from 24 to 27 February 2026 in Nouakchott.

66. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the work of the LEG and recommend draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

67. *Background:* The TEC and the CTCN prepare and submit a joint annual report to the COP⁶¹ and the CMA⁶² on their respective activities and the performance of their respective functions. SB 63 could not conclude consideration of this matter.⁶³

68. COP 30 and CMA 7 requested SB 64 to continue consideration of this matter on the basis of the latest draft text⁶⁴ prepared at SB 63.⁶⁵

69. *Action:* The SBI and the SBSTA will be invited to continue consideration of the joint annual report of the TEC and the CTCN for 2025 and recommend draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

(b) Alignment between processes pertaining to the review of the Climate Technology Centre and Network and the periodic assessment of the Technology Mechanism

70. *Background:* COP 26 and CMA 3 requested SBI 62 to initiate consideration of matters relating to the alignment between processes pertaining to the independent review of the CTCN and the periodic assessment of the Technology Mechanism with a view to recommending draft decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.⁶⁶

71. SBI 62 agreed to defer consideration of this matter to SBI 64.⁶⁷

72. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to initiate consideration of this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

(c) Host of the Climate Technology Centre

73. *Background:* COP 30 invited the evaluation panel convened by the secretariat to conduct an evaluation of the proposals submitted for hosting the Climate Technology Centre against the criteria set out in annex II to decision [10/CP.30](#), and to prepare an evaluation report, including information on whether and how the evaluation criteria have been met in the proposals, and to make the report available for consideration at SBI 64.⁶⁸

74. COP 30 and CMA 7 requested SBI 64 to recommend a draft decision on the new host of the Climate Technology Centre secretariat, on the basis of the evaluation report, for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.⁶⁹

75. COP 30 and CMA 7 also requested SBI 64 to recommend elements of a memorandum of understanding between the COP, the CMA and the proposed host.⁷⁰

76. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

77. *Background:* SBI 60 considered linkages, collaboration and cooperation between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism taking into account submissions from Parties and other stakeholders, the relevant 2024 synthesis report by the secretariat⁷¹ and outcomes from the relevant workshop held at that session⁷² with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 29.⁷³

78. At SBI 60, 61 and 62 it was agreed to continue consideration of this matter at the subsequent session.⁷⁴ SBI 63 could not conclude consideration of the matter.⁷⁵

79. COP 30 requested SBI 64 to continue consideration of this matter on the basis of the draft text⁷⁶ prepared at SBI 62.⁷⁷

80. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31.

(e) Second periodic assessment referred to in paragraph 69 of decision 1/CP.21

81. *Background:* CMA 4 requested SBI 64 to initiate the second periodic assessment of the effectiveness and adequacy of the support provided to the Technology Mechanism in supporting the implementation of the Paris Agreement on matters relating to technology development and transfer⁷⁸ in accordance with the scope of and modalities for the periodic assessment⁷⁹ with a view to it being completed at CMA 9.⁸⁰

82. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to initiate consideration of this matter.

(f) Poznan strategic programme on technology transfer

83. *Background:* COP 29 requested the secretariat, under the guidance of the TEC and in consultation with the Global Environment Facility, to prepare a report on the evaluation of the Poznan strategic programme on technology transfer, to take stock of progress, challenges and successes in and lessons learned from implementing the Poznan strategic programme.⁸¹

84. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter, taking into account the report referred to in paragraph 83 above, with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at COP 31.

13. Matters relating to finance

(a) Matters relating to the Adaptation Fund

85. *Background:* CMP 14 decided to ensure that developing country Parties and developed country Parties that are Parties to the Paris Agreement are eligible for membership on the AFB, and requested SBI 50 to consider this matter and forward a recommendation to CMP 15.⁸² CMP 16 requested the SBI to continue consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AFB and forward a recommendation for consideration at CMP 17.⁸³ CMA 4 requested SBI 58 to continue consideration of related matters, as needed, in view of the transition of the AF to exclusively serving the Paris Agreement.⁸⁴ SBI 58, 59 and 61 deferred consideration⁸⁵ and SBI 60 could not conclude consideration thereof.⁸⁶

86. CMP 19 and CMA 6 requested SBI 62 to consider the matter of the arrangements for the AF to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement and make recommendations thereon for consideration at CMP 20 and CMA 7 respectively.⁸⁷

87. The CMP decided to review the AF at CMP 7 and every three years thereafter.⁸⁸ CMP 17 requested SBI 62 to initiate the fifth review of the AF in accordance with the terms

of reference contained in the annex to decision [4/CMP.16](#), or as amended, and to report back to its governing bodies at the sessions to be convened in conjunction with COP 31.⁸⁹

88. SBI 62 continued consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AFB and additionally considered the matter of the arrangements for the AF to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement, as well as the initiation of the fifth review of the AF, and agreed that the consideration would continue at SBI 63 on the basis of the work⁹⁰ conducted at SBI 62.⁹¹

89. SBI 63 could not conclude consideration of matters relating to the AF and forwarded the matters to CMP 20 and CMA 7 for further consideration.⁹²

90. CMP 20 and CMA 7 requested SBI 64 to continue consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AFB, arrangements for the AF to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement and the initiation of the fifth review of the AF on the basis of the work⁹³ undertaken at SBI 63.⁹⁴

91. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to continue consideration of these matters with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at CMP 21 and CMA 8.

(b) Second review of the functions of the Standing Committee on Finance

92. *Background:* SBI 58 initiated the second review of the functions of the SCF⁹⁵ in accordance with the relevant terms of reference.⁹⁶ The review draws on, inter alia, a self-assessment report by the SCF and recommendations on improving the efficiency and effectiveness of the SCF.⁹⁷

93. SBI 59 considered this matter and agreed that the consideration would continue at SBI 61,⁹⁸ which in turn agreed that the consideration would continue at SBI 63.⁹⁹ SBI 63 agreed to defer consideration thereof to SBI 64.¹⁰⁰

94. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to complete its work on the review with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMA 8.

building framework¹⁰² and a compilation and synthesis report on the capacity-building work of bodies established under the Convention and its Kyoto Protocol and undertaken under the Paris Agreement.¹⁰³

96. SBI 62 was requested to initiate the fifth comprehensive review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in developing countries under the Convention.¹⁰⁴ SBI 63 agreed that consideration of this matter will continue at SBI 64 taking into account the draft text¹⁰⁵ prepared by the co-facilitators for the relevant agenda item at SBI 63 with a view to recommending a draft decision on the matter for consideration and adoption at COP 31.¹⁰⁶

97. CMP 20 requested SBI 64 to initiate the fifth comprehensive review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in developing countries established under decision [2/CP.7](#), and reaffirmed in decision [29/CMP.1](#), under the Kyoto Protocol in accordance with the terms of reference contained in the annex to decision [5/CMP.20](#).¹⁰⁷

98. COP 26 requested SBI 64 to initiate the sixth review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in countries with economies in transition established under decision [3/CP.7](#) under the Convention with a view to it being concluded at COP 31.¹⁰⁸

99. CMP 16 requested SBI 64 to initiate the sixth review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in countries with economies in transition established under decision [3/CP.7](#), and reaffirmed in decision [30/CMP.1](#), under the Kyoto Protocol with a view to it being concluded at COP 31.¹⁰⁹

100. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this matter with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 31 and CMP 21.

102. They requested the SBI to undertake a midterm review of progress at SBI 64 of the Glasgow work programme to evaluate its effectiveness, identify any emerging gaps and needs, and inform any consideration of improving the work programme, as appropriate.¹¹¹

103. COP 30 and CMA 7 invited Parties and non-Party stakeholders to submit views on matters to be addressed at the 2026 Dialogue on Action for Climate Empowerment and a technical workshop to be held at the Dialogue to discuss potential elements for a new action plan under the Glasgow work programme as part of the call for annual submissions on the Dialogue.¹¹²
